Describe the role of, and utilize when appropriate, complete tumor sequencing in identification of targetable mutations in pancreatic cancer to guide management. 2.) Incorporate knowledge of the evolving role of circulating tumor- DNA (ct-DNA) in prognosis, decisions regarding adjuvant therapy and in detection of early recurrence. 3.) Employ criteria for vascular resection in pancreatic cancer 4.) Identify pancreatic cystic lesions on cross-sectional imaging and recognize the high-risk stigmata and worrisome features that suggest the presence of cancer in these cysts. 5.) Describe histotripsy and recognize the potential of abscopal effect. 6.) Describe indications for evolving techniques in the treatment of metastatic colorectal cancer. 7.) Employ complex multidisciplinary discussions in patients with metastatic colorectal cancer given rapidly evolving treatment options that offer hope to patients with previously unresectable disease.

YOUNG HONG, MD, MPH, FACS, FSSO

Dr. Young K. Hong is Chief of the Division of Surgical Oncology and Associate Professor of Surgery at Cooper Medical School of Rowan University and the MD Anderson Cancer Center at Cooper. He also serves as Director of the Peritoneal Surface Malignancy Program, Director of Clinical Research, and Director of Cellular Therapy.

Dr. Hong completed his medical degree at Virginia Commonwealth University, followed by general surgery training at Georgetown University Hospital, fellowships in surgical oncology and hepatobiliary surgery at the University of Louisville, and research training at the National Cancer Institute. His clinical expertise includes hepatopancreatobiliary surgery, peritoneal surface malignancies, and cellular immunotherapies for gastrointestinal cancers.

An accomplished researcher, Dr. Hong has published extensively on surgical oncology, immunotherapy, and health policy, and serves on national committees for the Americas Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary Association, Society of Surgical Oncology, and Society for Surgery of the Alimentary Tract. He is recognized for his leadership in advancing surgical innovation, translational research, and mentorship of the next generation of surgical oncologists.



FLAVIO ROCHA, MD, FACS, FSSO

Hedinger Professor of Surgery Program Director, HPB Fellowship Physician-in-Chief, Knight Cancer Center Institute, Oregon Health & Science Center

Dr. Rocha is the Hedinger Professor and Chair of Surgical Oncology at Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) in Portland, OR. He also serves as the Physician-in-Chief of the Knight Cancer Institute at OHSU.

He graduated with honors from the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine. After training in general surgery at the Brigham and Women's Hospital and Harvard Medical School both in Boston, he completed both a surgical oncology and hepatopancreatobiliary surgery fellowship at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York City. He spent ten years practicing in Seattle prior to moving to Oregon in 2021.

Dr. Rocha's clinical practice encompasses all aspects of benign and malignant disease of the liver, bile ducts and pancreas. He has been funded by the AAS, NIH/NIDDK, ASCO and the Cholangiocarcinoma Foundation. Dr. Rocha currently sits on the editorial boards of Surgery, HPB, Annals of Surgical Oncology, and Journal of Surgical Oncology. He has served on the NCI Pancreas Task Force, ASCO Gastrointestinal Cancers Advisory Council and ASTRO Liver Cancer Guidelines Committee.

He is currently the surgical lead of the International Cholangiocarcinoma Research Network (ICRN), Vice-Chair of the Southwest Oncology Group (SWOG) Surgery Committee, GI Surgery Working Group Chair at Eastern Cooperative Group (ECOG-ACRIN) and Chair of the Cancer Standards Development Committee at the American College of Surgeons.






