- 1. Acute Glaucoma: Acute Glaucoma most commonly denotes Acute Angle closure glaucoma but in reality, there are a number of etiologies that can present as acute glaucoma. Wil present cases that presented as acute glaucoma to our practice and their management.
- 2. **Chronic angle closure glaucoma (CACG):** CACG management differs based on the underlying etiology. Patients with creeping angle closure glaucoma presentation and management is different from those with Plateau Iris syndrome or those with Nanopthalmos. We present cases that presented as chronic angle closure glaucoma but from different etiologies and there management.
