2 Interpret common musculoskeletal radiographs.

3 Recognize, describe, and manage various fractures: simple, stable, closed and nondisplaced.

4 Diagnose and manage various musculoskeletal sprains and strains.

5 Reproduce appropriate diagnostic work up and management of the following sports medicine diagnosis:

a. Fractures, b. Meniscal tears, c. Recurrent dislocations (e.g. shoulder, patella).

6 Evaluate and manage various sports medicine emergencies: a. Acute Compartment Syndrome, b. Hip Dislocation, c. Knee Dislocation, d. Pelvis Fracture, e. Cervical Spine Fracture, f. Cord Injury.

7 Employ appropriate use of pharmacologic treatments.
