## Objectives:

1. Assess physician workforce needs in Arizona and determine what innovative curricular models may address these needs.
2. Analyze differences between the Longitudinal Integrated Clerkship (LIC) model and Traditional Block Rotations in relation to educational outcomes, continuity of care, and student wellness.
3. Discuss innovative 3-year MD accelerated pathways as a statewide solution to improve physician workforce in areas and disciplines of need pertaining to benefits to learner and residency program.
4. Develop plan to determine key stake holders to apply lessons learned at attendee's specific institutions pertaining to UME to GME continuum and strategies to alleviate workforce needs.
