## **Imaging of Orbital Masses**

October 15, 2025 – 12:00 PM Tucson

#### **Overall Activity Objectives:**

- 1 Select diagnostic imaging procedures that are appropriate for the disease, while keeping the use of ionizing radiation to a practical minimum.
- 2 Develop differential diagnosis and management of both emergent and non-emergent body imaging findings.
- 3 Develop differential diagnosis of commonly encountered abnormalities and their appearances.
- 4 Practice cost-effective medicine by not over ordering costly imaging procedures.
- 5 Educate PCPs and other practitioners how to provide relevant clinical information to the diagnostic radiologist, so that the results can be interpreted in the appropriate clinical setting.
- 6 Inform patients on the nature of the diagnostic imaging procedures they undergo and why they are being done.
- 7 Incorporate new techniques for acquiring medical images or performing image-guided interventions.

- 1 Formulate a differential diagnosis for orbital masses on the basis of their location and imaging features.
- 2 Recognize specific imaging features of orbital neoplasms
- 3 Recognize specific imaging features of inflammatory and vascular lesions mimicking neoplasms
